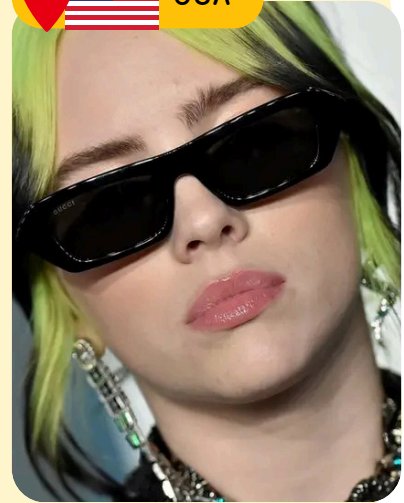

Plastic wet wipes to be banned

England has officially announced a ban on wet wipes that contain plastic, a move that will help protect rivers, oceans, and wildlife. The ban kicks in from spring 2027 and comes after experts revealed that plastic wet wipes cause huge sewer blockages and break down into tiny microplastics that harm the environment. The change means companies will now switch to biodegradable, plastic-free versions instead.
