The new bee, named Megachile Lucifer, is the first of its kind to be found in over 20 years. Experts think its little horns might help it collect pollen or protect itself. The name "Lucifer" means "light bringer" in Latin.

In Fife, Scotland, Sharon and Andy Longhurst have turned their house into a special hedgehog hospital to care for sick and injured hedgehogs. They've built tiny wards, intensive care units, and even have volunteers driving "hedgehog ambulances." Since starting Burntisland Hedgehog Haven almost three years ago, they've cared for more than 560 hedgehogs, nursing them back to health and releasing them back into the wild.
