Now, a robot with smart "eyes" and flexible hands can spot matching colours and gently piece the artwork back together faster than humans. Scientists hope this amazing machine will help restore precious artefacts all over the world!

Telescope snaps cosmic butterfly

A giant cosmic "butterfly" has been spotted fluttering through space! A telescope in Chile captured a new picture of the Butterfly Nebula, a huge cloud of glowing gas 2,500 to 3,800 light-years away. Its bright "wings" were formed when an old star shed its outer layers long ago, creating colourful, glowing shapes that stretch out like a butterfly in space.
