Teens discover ancient roman villa

Students in Rome have helped uncover a 1,800-year-old Roman villa hidden beneath their school. The teens, who locked themselves inside the building during the COVID-19 pandemic to protest against remote learning, discovered a network of chambers and tunnels beneath their gym. After they alerted a teacher, archaeologists began excavating the site in 2025. They have now uncovered a luxurious Roman home filled with colourful artwork, intricate mosaics and beautifully decorated rooms that would once have belonged to a wealthy family. The site could one day open to visitors, with the students even helping to lead tours of their discovery.
